Words with /aw/ spelt
'augh' and 'au'

caught	naughty
taught	daughter
autumn	clause
cause	astronaut
applaud	author

'augh' makes the 'aw' sound in the middle of tricky words like 'caught' or 'daughter'.

Use 'au' for the 'aw' sound at the start or middle of words – like 'autumn' or 'August'.



Maths:

This year, we are placing a strong emphasis on multiplication in preparation for the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) taking place in July. To support this, all children are expected to complete set weekly sessions on Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS).

TTRS is a fun, engaging, and effective way to build speed and accuracy with times tables. Regular practice is essential, and we have assigned specific sessions each week to help children steadily improve and gain confidence. These sessions are monitored, and children are expected to complete them as part of their weekly homework.

Please support your child by encouraging them to log in to TTRS and complete their sessions on time. Just a few minutes of focused practice each day can make a big difference!
