Reading

Please remember to read with your child **daily** and support them with understanding through comprehension of the text and not just decoding. Please sign and date the reading record each time you hear them read. If you have any comments you wish to write about your child's reading, please do so.

English:

This week in English, we have continued our work on the book *Night of the Gargoyles*, focusing on description of settings and cohesion between paragraphs
TASK: Complete pages 6 – 7 in your CGP Comprehension Book. Mark your work using the answers in the back of the book. This is due in on **Tuesday 1st October.**

Spellings:

Spellings will be tested on Mondays

This week we have practised words with suffixes.

TASK: Choose the easier or more challenging task. **Easier** – learn the ten spellings and practise using them in sentences. **More challenging** – add the suffixes correctly to ten words, learn them and practise using them in sentences. These will be tested on **Monday 30th September.**

Maths:

Please complete TTRS in addition to the maths TASK.

This week in maths we have continued to focus on place value, counting beyond zero and finding the difference between negative and positive numbers.

TASK: Complete pages 1 – 7 in your CGP Maths Book. Mark your work using the answers in the back of the book. This is due in on **Tuesday 1st October.**

Subject of the Week: This week the focus is National Poetry Day.

Next Thursday is National Poetry Day. To celebrate this, I would like you to find a favourite poem that you would like to perform – either read or recite (from memory) to our class. The poem can be on any subject and can be short or long. Choose one that you really like and will enjoy performing. Think about pace, using your voice and projecting your voice – if you are performing, you need to consider your audience. Don't forget to practise! This is due in on **Thursday 3rd October.**
