Reading

English:

This week in English, we have continued our work on the book *Night of the Gargoyles*, focusing on description through expanded noun phrases, relative clauses and using senses.

TASK: The task this week is a grammar recap based on relative clauses and relative pronouns. This is due in on **Tuesday 24th September**.

This week we have reviewed homophones.

TASK: Either used the attached list of homophones (easier challenge) or find 10 pairs of your own (more challenging). Investigate the meanings and write pairs of sentences for each pair of homophones.

Maths:

This week in maths we have continued to focus on place value, ordering numbers including numbers up to millions and numbers with up to 3 decimal places.

TASK: Complete the worksheet – choose the easier or more challenging worksheet. You may print it and write on the worksheet or just write the answers in your book. **Remember to mark your work.** This is due in on **Tuesday 24th September**.

Subject of the Week: This week the focus is History.

Our new topic is based around the census and what it can tell us about the history in our local area. Mary Bucktrout, who you found out about in history this week, worked in a flax mill when she was about 13 or 14 in the 1840s. What can you find out about the work that children would have undertaken locally – around Waltham Cross and Cheshunt – in the nineteenth century? You can write about what you can find out or create a leaflet or information poster for the history display. You may need to visit either Cheshunt or Waltham Cross library to help you to research. They



each have books on local history and the librarians are always willing to point you in the right direction. This is due in on **Tuesday 24th September.**
